The Presidents Club of Dayton is a Non-Profit organization that accomplishes many things in our community and with your help can do more:

We are providing paid members **(only \$100 annual membership fee)** free use of our Zoom Account for meetings with no time limit. Speaker's Bios

John McManus is proud to serve the residents of our community as Montgomery County Treasurer. He was elected to the position in November of 2020 and assumed office in September of 2021. As Treasurer, John is responsible for the collection of property taxes, the safeguarding of county funds, and the careful management of the county's investment portfolio. He is also a member of the board of directors of the Montgomery County Land Bank, and is committed to helping our neighborhoods turn delinquent, neglected, and abandoned properties back to productive use.

Prior to his role as Treasurer, John served as Chief Deputy to Montgomery County Clerk of Courts Mike Foley. As Chief Deputy, John was responsible for the management and oversight of the Criminal, Civil, Domestic Relations, Appellate, Records, and Bookkeeping & Finance Departments for the Montgomery County Clerk of Courts. He was also responsible for the management and oversight of the Clerk's Help Center. During and prior to his role as Chief Deputy Clerk, John served 150,000 residents of Dayton, Riverside, Trotwood,

Harrison Township and Jefferson Township as a member of the Dayton Board of Education from 2016 to 2020. John was elected to the position in 2015, while still a full-time student in law school at the University of Dayton. John held various positions during his four years of service, including as Board Vice President and Finance Chairman.

Prior to moving from Memphis to Dayton to pursue higher education, John worked in state and federal government in a number of capacities. After graduating from college, John served as a White House Staff Assistant in the administration of President George W. Bush. He was assigned to the Executive Office of the President. He served as Legislative Liaison and Public Information Officer for Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam, advocating for more efficient human resource policies for state government. Additionally, John served as a Regulatory and Publications Specialist for Tennessee Secretary of State Tre Hargett. In this role, John was responsible for regulatory assignments related to all of state government's departments, agencies, boards, and commissions.

John holds a Juris Doctor from the University of Dayton School of Law and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from the University of Memphis. He resides in Centerville.

Sean McCauley was born on Andrews A.F.B in Maryland but moved to the Dayton area when he was eight when his father transferred to Wright Patterson. He attended and graduated from Oakwood High School. - Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine 2020, Dr. Kizzmekia Corbett (1986-Present)
- <u>Automatic Elevator Doors 1887</u>, Alexander Miles (1838-1918)
- Improved the Ironing Board 1892, Sarah Boone (1832-1904)
- <u>Refrigerated Trucks 1940</u>, Frederick McKinley Jones (1893-1961)
- <u>Three-Signal Traffic Light 1923</u>, **Garrett Morgan (1877-1963)** He also upgraded the <u>Sewing Machine</u> and created the <u>Gas Mask</u>
- <u>Central Heating Furnace Using Gas 1919</u>, Alice H. Parker (1885-1920)
- <u>Mailbox 1891</u>, **Philip B. Downing (1857-1934)** invented the "street letter box," the predecessor of the mailboxes today
- Video Security System 1966, Marie Van Brittan Brown (1922-1999)

Outstanding is outstanding. People are people, and we all have a part to play in making our humanity great. Dig deep and learn more about the contributions of Black Americans and let us value all Americans.

Hope Taft had the privilege of being First Lady of Ohio for 1999-2007. During that time, her passion for nature blossomed with the creation of the Heritage Garden at the Governor's Residence. It is the state's botanical garden of native plants arranged in areas reminiscent to their natural habitats. She leads a volunteer force of nearly 100 people from 13 counties to help maintain this oasis of native plants designed to encourage people to use Ohio natives in their own yards. She is a cofounder of Ohio Native Plant Month that will be celebrated for the first time in April 2020. A bill was passed by the State Legislature in 2019.

She is an honorary Master Gardener and an Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist and a trained instructor for the Landscape for Life program, a part of the SITES certification for land owners.

When the Taft's moved to Greene County, her love for conservation came to the fore. She co-founded the Little Miami River Kleeners and The Little Miami Watershed Network to help maintain the high quality of the Little Miami River through education, conservation, and sustainability. She recently helped to establish the Ohio Scenic Rivers Assn, a statewide effort to protect Ohio's most beautiful and healthy rivers.

Rebecca Victor is the Executive Director of Little Miami Watershed Network. She brings her experiences in business, marketing, organizational structure, and volunteerism to support the next phase of development for this expanding organization. She has always been a strong advocate for the environment, and her love for the Little Miami River began when as a young mother she wanted to introduce her two sons to the wonders of nature.

Later that year, Sheriff Streck was promoted to the rank of Deputy Sheriff served in the Operation Division as a patrol deputy in Harrison, Jefferson, & Washington Townships. In 2003, Sheriff Streck was assigned as a detective in the Inspectional Services Unit, where he was responsible for conducting internal investigations for the Sheriff's Office & numerous other law enforcement agencies. Sheriff Streck also served Montgomery County as a member of the SWAT team during this period.



In 2004, Sheriff Streck was promoted to the rank of Sergeant. As a Sergeant, he was assigned to the County Jail, Court Services, & the Inspectional Services Unit. During

2005 & 2006, he also served as the Sheriff's Office Accreditation Manager for the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).

Sheriff Streck was promoted to the rank of Captain on October 13, 2006 & was assigned as the Assistant Division Commander of the Support Services Division. As the Assistant Division Commander he was tasked with overseeing the creation & implementation of the Regional Dispatch Center. In 2008, he was assigned as the Commander of the newly created Dispatch Center.

In 2007, Sheriff Streck joined the Police Athletic League where he served as the President, Vice President & is currently the Sergeant at Arms.

He was promoted to the rank of Chief Deputy on January 1, 2013 where he oversaw the day to day operations of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office.

In August 2013, Sheriff Streck was asked along with several others to create a Coalition that would produce realistic options for the individuals involved in the growing opioid epidemic. On January 6, 2019, he was appointed as the newest Sheriff of Montgomery County & was elected Sheriff in January of 2021.

He obtained his degree in Criminal Justice Administration from Columbia Southern Univ. In December 2014, he graduated from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Academy.

In 2021, he achieved the Certified Law Enforcement Manager (C.L.E.M.) award through the Buckeye State Sheriff's Assoc. And in June 2022, he was presented with the prestigious Triple Crown award from the National Sheriff's Assocation

History of Flight In Southern California

The Wright Brothers did not make it to California during their lifetime. However, a replica of their 1902 Glider, as seen in my photograph <u>View From The Top Of Big Kill Devil Hill</u>, is at the California Science Center. Very soon after the Wright Brothers became famous for their discovery of lighter-than-air-controlled flight, southern California became an entrepreneurial hub for flight. The Los Angeles International Air Meet was held in January 1910 at Dominguez Field. Many famous people took their first flight at this event, including Hurst. Cal Rodgers left New York City on September 17, 1911, in a Wright Flyer B and landed in Pasadena on November 5, completing the first U.S. transcontinental flight. The first municipal flight school and the first municipal airfield were located in Long Beach, California, in 1919. Southern California was also the home of Douglas Aircraft Company, Lockheed Aircraft Company, and the Hughes Aircraft Company, to name a few.



The Presidents Club of Dayton is a Non-Profit organization that accomplishes many things in our community and with your help can do more:

We are providing paid members **(only \$100 annual membership fee)** free use of our Zoom Account for meetings with no time limit. Just schedule your meeting through Tony Massoud via <u>presidentsclubdayton@aol.com</u> to make sure the time you want is available. We will provide the assistance for you to log on and use.

We are co-sponsors for the Bob Chiles Golf Outing, The Presidents Club of Dayton with Miami Valley Military Affairs Association since 1990 has donated over \$160,000 to the Fisher houses & over \$12,000 to First Sergeant's Association at WPAB. Our Citizen Legion of Honor Award is one of the most Prestigious Volunteer Awards in our community. We are donating four scholarships a year to Sinclair College each at \$2500 a year. Our current endowment for the four scholarships is self-

sustaining to help maintain higher education for worthy students in our area who achieve high scholastics and volunteerism. The Presidents Club has raised over \$400,000 for Sinclair Scholarships because organizations like yours over the years with their \$100 membership fee, and fund-raising support have helped raised these monies.

• • Add the event to the calendar and "SAVE," this will ensure your time is scheduled. Do not forget to set your start time and end time because other organizations will need to schedule.

• Please email the details to tmassoud211@cs.com and include in the details of the meeting who the Leader will be with their email address, do you want a password for your participants to enter Zoom or Waiting Room or Both. Do you want your meeting videotaped? Tony Massoud will setup your organization's Zoom meeting for you if you need help contact Tony.

• Use someone who is familiar with Zoom. It is quite easy to use with a computer, laptop, smartphone, or telephone.
