# What is The Club's Mission

**S E R V I C E S** as an information exchange regarding speakers and programs to help clubs get the best available.

This is accomplished by:

↳ Conducting a monthly membership meeting at which time speakers from various community organizations, agencies or businesses give a preview of a program they can offer at the member service clubs' meetings.

↳ Communicating through a monthly newsletter to officers of all member clubs notifying them of upcoming events to be held by The Presidents Club or other member service clubs and a listing of "top-rated programs" on our website and social media.

↳ **P R O V I D E S** a common communications pipeline for all member service clubs in the area.

↳ **S P O N S O R S** student scholarships at Sinclair Community College given out annually to worthy students who show a volunteer commitment to the community.

↳ **S U P P O R T S** and encourages volunteer leadership in area clubs by hosting an annual breakfast at which two Outstanding Community or Service Club Members are selected from each member service club and honored.

↳ The president, vice-president, immediate past president and all designated representatives of each member club, officers of The Presidents Club and past presidents of The Presidents Club.

# CITIZEN LEGION OF HONOR Award

The Presidents Club sponsors and recognizes each year's outstanding volunteer citizen leader in the Metropolitan Dayton Area through the Citizen Legion of Honor Luncheon held each October.

The Citizen Legion of Honor Award is presented annually to the citizen of the Dayton community who, in the opinion of the Selection Committee of The Presidents Club, best meets all these qualifications:

↳ The person whose long-term volunteer leadership and activities have benefited the greatest number of people.

↳ The person whose single act has been of greatest benefit.

↳ The person who has demonstrated a commitment to programs or organizations that have a regional impact.

\*Nominations are accepted from member clubs, past presidents and past recipients only.

# Wall of Honor

Sponsored by the Dayton company Winsupply, Inc. and hosted by the City of Dayton on the 3rd floor of the Dayton Convention Center, each Citizen Legion of Honor recipient is recognized in a permanent location designed to acknowledge the volunteer's service to our region. Each honoree, since 1951, shares a place with his and her peers symbolizing the volunteer and human spirit of the servant leaders in our community.

The Wall is open to visitors year-round during normal hours of the Dayton Convention Center. A kiosk featuring the honorees is located both at the Dayton Convention Center and at Carillon Park Dayton History.

Member clubs donate to this fund and a committee of The Presidents Club, in collaboration with local college personnel, selects four deserving students to receive a scholarship, which is awarded, annually, at the Citizen Legion of Honor Luncheon and Annual Meeting. Scholarships are funded by the proceeds of the Citizen Legion of Honor Luncheon.

## HOW IS IT FINANCED

↳ The Presidents Club is financed by nominal dues. Each member club pays the same contribution.

## HOW IS IT OPERATED

↳ Incorporated by the State of Ohio and under the IRS 501(c)3 status, The Presidents Club has a Code of Regulations by which it is governed. A board of directors, consisting of elected positions inclusive of president, president-elect and vice presidents, an appointed secretary and treasurer, and immediate past president, is the governing body of the club. (To become an officer of The Presidents Club it is mandatory that the nominees are currently serving as an officer of their service club or have served in that capacity.) The board conducts all official business of the club using parliamentary procedures as outlined in the newly revised Robert's Rules of Order.

↳ An Advisory Council, made up of all past presidents of The Presidents Club, is on call at the president's discretion if any assistance is needed on projects, events, or issues.
